Take Audubon Parkway from Owensboro to Exit 18 (first exit -Sorgho/Stanley) turn right then about 100 feet turn left onto Hambleton Ferry Road.
(after you turn right, be careful not to take the exit back onto the parkway).

Hambleton Ferry runs parallel to the parkway. Drive about 1 mile to a red brick house on the left. There will be a grey garage and a white fence between the house and the garage. Phone number 771-4635 if you miss the turn onto Hambleton from Ferry.

Directions from Henderson:

Take Audubon Parkway, to Exit 18 (first exit after crossing the Green River) turn left - go over the parkway and pass the entrance to return to the parkway, turn left onto Hambleton Ferry Road and follow the above directions.
